Mental Health and Stress Management Workshops



Over the course of the next five weeks, one of our Board Child and Youth Workers will be facilitating weekly lesson plans that support the ongoing development of mental health literacy and stigma. These lessons were developed by education and mental health experts and are promoted by School Mental Health Ontario with the intention of teaching skills that support students to name and identify emotions, increase awareness and coping skills and teach general stress reduction strategies. These general strategies are evidenced based and "good for all" approaches that have been developed for younger students.
