Cross Country



September 30th is National Truth and Reconciliation Day.

We will observe this on September 29, 2023 at school.

In order to understand what it means to *Reconcile* with Indigenous people, we first need to learn about the *Truth*.

When we know the truth and can talk about the truth, we can take the next steps that are needed to reconcile and make things better.



We need to learn the history AND listen to Indigenous people's stories, like Phyllis who brought her orange shirt to wear to residential school and was told to remove it.

We wear orange as a symbol to show our commitment to honoring the truth and taking the steps needed towards reconciliation.

Through Canadian history, Indigenous people, and more specifically, Indigenous children were forced to become more European and less Indigenous. The word often used to describe forcing a group of people to become more like another group is assimilation. When Canada become a country, the Canadian government thought it would be better if everyone in Canada was the same and the people had a shared language and culture. Unfortunately, this led to the terrible treatment of Indigenous people including the creation of Residential Schools and the Indian Act

Canada's leaders at the time believed that this would unify Canada. They thought if Indigenous people forgot about their Indigenous roots, this would make Canada more orderly and less complicated. The way they thought to do this is by trying to teach children to forget about their backgrounds in Residential Schools. Indigenous families had children stolen from them by force so they could attend Residential Schools.

The Indian Act, created in 1876, gave a lot of power to the Canadian government over the Indigenous people. They would decide who could receive rights and benefits and they controlled the elections that Indigenous people held. The Act also made it illegal for Indigenous people to vote in Canadian elections or practice their religious ceremonies. It was called the Indian Act, even though Indigenous folks did not want to be referred to as Indians, and it is STILL called the Indian Act today.

Over the years, more changes were made to the Indian Act to make it harder and harder for Indigenous people to live in Canada without assimilating. Some became very ashamed of their heritage and felt that they had to hide it and pretend they weren't Indigenous.

When we take steps towards reconciliation, we are taking the time to learn about Indigenous people - their culture, language, customs, history, beliefs and traditions.

We should celebrate Indigenous people and their history and welcome them into our communities as they have welcomed us into theirs!
